## A Minister's Musings

*Therefore as a prisoner for the Lord, I encourage you to live as people worthy of the call you received from God.*

Ephesians 4:1

Beginning in in June, Pastor Paul and I will be preaching a Summer Series on 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Samuel that Pastor Paul jokingly refers to as "Game of Thrones." The book of Samuel takes place in a period of Israel's history when the people were demanding a King so they could be like other nations, even though that was not what God wanted for them. This story begins with the birth of and calling of Samuel to be God's prophet. At first Samuel has a hard time discerning who it is that is calling him and he is convinced it is Eli, his mentor.

This situation brings to mind the difficulty we sometimes have in hearing God's call. Some questions that may come to mind are, "Am I really hearing God clearly or is this just something I want? Am I worthy or equipped to handle this task I'm being asked to do? How do I know the difference? Would God ask me to do something out of my comfort zone?" Of course short of an angel appearing or an actual audible voice, it is difficult to know the answer for sure. Sometimes we just have to step out in faith.

I recently experienced this very thing when asked to be Vice-Moderator for the Presbytery. I was asked to serve as the Vice-Moderator for this year, become the Moderator the following year, and then Chair the Presbytery Commission the third year. I can honestly admit that none of those positions were anything to which I had ever desired or aspired. They are also not especially positions of which I feel particularly gifted as I understand them. I am not a gifted Parliamentarian (Robert's Rules of Order) or a particularly great administrator, so why in the heck would someone (or God) think I could do that? In addition to those two things, the thought of moderating a Presbytery meeting absolutely terrifies me. As I began to think and pray about it though, I started to ask myself whether I had other gifts I could bring to the Presbytery and the meetings that might be different. Ultimately I did decide to step out of my comfort zone and agreed to give it a try. This Saturday at First Pres. San Bernardino I will be installed as Vice-Moderator at the Presbytery meeting. I covet your prayers and support as I explore something that will enable me to stretch and grow.

## A Pastor's Ponderings

*So welcome each other, in the same way that Christ also welcomed you, for God's glory. -1 Corinthians 15:7*

On a Sunday morning in May, a church member walked up to me and asked, "Where's the welcome?" With a puzzled look on my face, I said, "huh?" She responded, "Where did the welcome banner go? Its not out there." We had looked around and have been unable to locate it; perhaps someone may have walked off with it. I have been thinking recently about the question I heard that morning, "Where's the welcome?"

On May 20th, at the end of the Unity Service, Tom and Caitlin Hutchinson made a presentation during worship to Gale and the Teunissen Family, expressing appreciation for the work and legacy of the Teunissen Family in the life and history of MagPres. This was commemorated by a street sign that has been placed at the corner of the walkway (now named Teunissen Way) and the parking lot (now named Teunissen Place). One of the memories that was shared was how Bill and Gale would be "pre-greeters," standing on that walkway and welcoming all people by name.

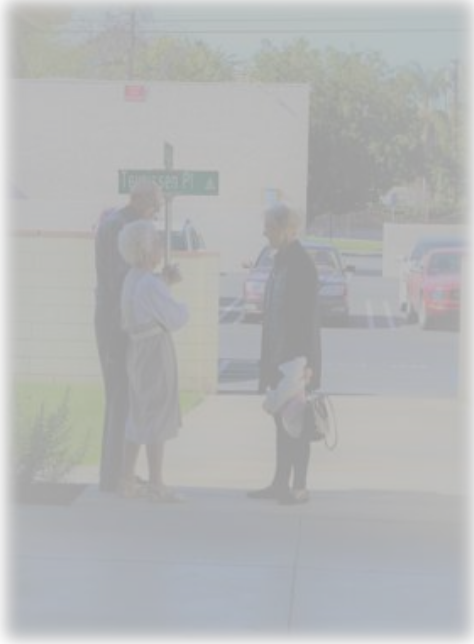
When I first arrived at MagPres as one of your Co-Pastors, I asked a great many of you "what brought you to MagPres" and "what keeps you here?" In your responses to these questions, many of you indicated that "being greeted/welcome by the Teunissens" was a warm and important memory that encouraged your participation at MagPres.

While reflecting on this legacy of welcome expressed by the Teunissens and remembered fondly by many of you, I recalled the question I had been thinking about, "Where's the welcome?" While I am grateful for the people who volunteer regularly to greet people and the deacons who organize the greeters, I wonder if there might also be people in our congregation who feel uniquely called to the ministry that the Teunissens so greatly exercised. I wonder if there are people who might regularly welcome as "pre-greeters" those making their way into worship. I wonder if there might be a new generation of Teunissens welcoming people by name, creating warm and fond memories of their experience at MagPres. I wonder.

Our welcome banner no longer sits along Magnolia Avenue and the Teunissens are no longer found on their spot along the walkway on Sunday mornings. So, where's the welcome?

## Deacon's Corner

The first Sunday of every month when Communion is served, a deacon offering is taken at the door. The pastors announce it as means to provide for the ministries of the deacons. Since becoming a deacon in January, I have had the opportunity to learn more about one of those ministries, Lutheran Social Services.

Every month our church gives a \$200 donation to LSS through the deacon's account. On even numbered months, I buy and deliver \$200 worth of food. A \$200 check is sent on the odd numbered months. In April when I delivered the food, I noticed there was an abundance of canned corn, green beans, and baked beans on the shelves. I asked what other kinds of food they needed. The person helping me suggested **proteins like canned meats and peanut butter**. She also said they need **canned fruit and boxes of cereal**. I was surprised to learn that their clients can only receive \$25 worth of food a month. That isn't very much.

I listed some suggested food items for the pantry because of Toucan Sunday. This is another way you can help our ministry to LSS. Gary and Edith Grant deliver this food to the pantry. I think the name Toucan Sunday is used because it's a catchy name that's supposed to stick in our minds. If you're like me, I always forget. Food can be donated anytime and you don't have to limit yourself to two items. There's always a bright blue cart in the narthex where food can be left. I hope you take advantage of these two simple ways you can help feed hungry families in Riverside. The deacons depend on your generosity.
