#### A Pastor's Pondering

Every time I return to Hawaii to visit family, I am usually asked some form of this question: Why are you Presbyterian? My usual answer is, "For me, this flavor of Christianity is closest to what I envision God's Church to be; specifically, no matter how far left (liberal, progressive, etc.) or how far right (conservative, fundamentalist, etc.), there is room at the table. Not only room, we value including all voices."

Last month, the dramatic saga of US politics added another chapter as Robert Mueller was questioned by Congress for all the world to see. Interestingly, the political divide seemed to widen as different sides, looking at the same testimony, came to vastly different conclusions. Each side tried to drown out the other side's narrative with their own perspective.

Also last month, I had a memorable experience at the Presbyterian Youth Triennium held at Purdue University in Indiana. On one evening, I found myself surrounded by high schoolers, most of whom were from the Presbytery of Riverside, but a couple were from another presbytery. We played a few games together to keep ourselves entertained and as those who were from another presbytery were preparing to leave, one of them said, "There is something different here. There is something alive and active. In this group you have a Trump supporter, a gay [person], a transgender person, different races, and it doesn't matter, you get along anyway. That is not like any church I've ever been to."

I wonder if the church that this high school student experienced on this particular evening could be found here on the campus of MagPres? I wonder if this type of church actually exists in Southern California? I wonder what would happen if the label Presbyterian meant one could experience this regularly?

"I am Presbyterian because for me, this flavor of Christianity is the closest to what I envision God's Church to be..." I pray that you might experience this too.

Persons of spiritual character, honest repute, exemplary lives, brotherly and sisterly love, sincere compassion, and sound judgment should be chosen for this ministry." Book of Order (The Constitution of the Presbyterian Church)

Having sat as Clerk of Session for 9 years and before that, served a 3-year term as an Elder, Chairing both Membership and Social Programming Committees, I put my organizational, marketing and time management skills to good use.

As the Nominating Committee starts to make their calls to members to also serve, I hope you, too, will ask yourself if God wants you to stretch yourself and serve MagPres. in a new way. You may find a renewed spiritual growth serving with and for amazing people.

As a skilled inventor, John Muir was a prized factory employee in Indianapolis. If not for an industrial accident in his 20s, he may have spent his life making things indoors. But after recovering from being temporarily blinded, Muir headed on a 1,000-mile walk to "consider the lilies." He then began doing that literally, as a botanist.

To his résumé, the 19th-century Renaissance man added naturalist, glaciologist, conservationist, founder of the Sierra Club, and Father of National Parks. Yet when Muir was asked what he did, he replied simply, "I study the inventions of God."


