

## Minister's Musing

Then the Spirit led Jesus up into the wilderness ...

Matthew 4:1

re you a Christmas or Easter person? If I could take a survey, my guess would be that most people will answer Christmas. If you went into my garage and tried to judge my answer to that based on how many bins of decorations I have for each holiday, you would probably guess that my an-



swer would be Christmas. But you would be wrong. I am an Easter person. In fact of all the seasons of the church year, Lent leading up to and including Easter is my favorite time in the church calendar (and it's not because my favorite color is purple either). Maybe it comes from growing up in a very liturgical Episcopal church with all of the ritual and symbolism. However, I suspect it is something more. Since childhood I have been drawn to introspection and felt God's presence in my life. Later on it did not always feel that way. There were definitely times, especially during times of difficulty or doubt when God seemed very far away. And yet God would not let me go and in fact pursued me to the point of calling me to Ordained ministry.

It is easy especially in this time we find ourselves to be distracted by life that goes on around us. Whether it is world events, politics, making a living, social media and more, there is always something that wants to call us away from God. Lent is a time where we can refocus, regroup, renew, and maybe minimize a distraction or two that takes us away from hearing God's voice. This Lent, Pastor Paul and I will be preaching on the Lenten series **seeking: honest questions for deeper faith.** This is a perfect time to consider what God is trying to communicate to us through our questions and setting aside time to listen. We have printed devotions to aid you in your Lenten journey and it is not too late to begin. Whether you use these materials or something of your own choosing, my prayer is that you will feel God's presence along the way as you observe a Holy Lent-



## **CORNER**



St. Patrick's Day celebrates a Romano-British priest who spread Christianity to Ireland in the 4<sup>th</sup> Century. He did not drive out the snakes but challenged the pagan beliefs of that era. He reportedly used the shamrock to demonstrate the trinity of God with the three leaves.

Both these men followed the teachings of the gospel, giving aid to the oppressed and spreading the word of Christ Jesus. These are also the commands to us as Christians. We see the need for this daily with the poor and unhoused whether it is due to the

economy, drugs, or mental health.

In Matthew 25 the final judgement is described. I was hungry and you gave me food. I was thirsty and you gave me drink. I was a stranger and you welcomed me. I was naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me. We are to do this to the least of us according to this passage. As a church, we support Family Promise, the pantry at Lutheran Social Services, and with the Christmas food boxes and Blessing Bags. We try but it is not always easy.

Romans 10:14 asks the question about spreading the gospel. "How are they to believe in him whom they have never heard? How are they to hear without someone preaching? Faith comes from hearing through the word of Christ." I know that it is not always easy talking to others about our faith.

If it was easy, everyone would do it. If only it were so. We do what we can. A smile and a greeting can be a good start. So, God bless you and have a great day!




