### Minister's Musing

D ince announcing my retirement two months ago, and with a month to go, I am being asked two questions more than any other; "What are you going to do with your free time?" and "You'll still be able to come to church here right?" A third question I am also asked is, "Are you going to stay in the area?"

As I think about what I will do with my free time, I am trying to remain open. I imagine I will sleep a lot the first 6 months. I'd like to start exercising regularly and being out in nature. I need to clean out closets and my

garage- again! I have a trip to Scotland planned in October that I am looking forward to. I will still be involved at the Presbytery level, at least for a while. As I mentioned in my letter to you all, I would like to concentrate on developing a Spiritual Direction practice. That being said if you know of anyone who is searching for a deeper understanding of themselves and their relationship to God, I hope you will direct them my way. In March of 2022, I received my Certificate in Spiritual Direction after 2 years of study. It is something to which I feel called and believe fits my gifts.

As far as coming to church here at MagPres, I will be signing a covenant outlining boundaries that I agree to keep when I retire. One of those boundaries is to not attend church services or functions for at least one year after my retirement. If or when a new pastor is called, the one year will start over. This is to ensure that Pastor Paul and you, the congregation, can adjust to this new transition. The Ministerial Ethics Guidelines Policy states the pastor shall fulfill these guidelines "by declining all requests from members of that church to conduct baptisms, weddings, funerals, and other pastoral duties." Two exceptions will be a wedding in June that I am co-officiating with Pastor Paul that I committed to prior to my announcement, and the grand opening of the new Sanctuary, if the darned thing is ever built! Amanda also is choosing to leave with me so please keep her in your prayers as this is also a transition for her. She has felt very welcomed and loved here and has thought of MagPres as her church home.

As my time here is coming to a close, I find myself realizing how difficult it will be to not be with you all. I said in my initial letter that you are very dear to me and we have been through a lot together. The reality of how much I will miss you is becoming more apparent every day and yet I trust that God will be with us both and has a wonderful future ahead for MagPres.





#### Rewired ...

Magnolia is embarking on a new era as Co-Pastor Claire retires, her last day being April 30, with her retirement date of May 1, 2023.

At February's Session meeting, Lee Ireland, from Presbytery's Healthy Pastors and Congregations Commission (HPCC) attended. He presented the following questions to Session as a guide moving forward in deciding on a Pastor model:

What is your membership now as compared to when you first started the co-pastor model?

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

How has COVID affected your church's ministry? What adaptations have you made that would impact what capabilities and talents you want in a pastor?

How has giving changed over the last 3 years? Can you still 'afford' the co-pastor model?

Is the aging of your congregation going to affect the ministry you have now? Will different capabilities and talents be needed in your church than what you have now – not just pastors, but deacons and elders in ministry?

If you intend to go to a solo pastor, does the pastor need support in certain areas since the co-pastor model you had covered all areas of ministry? For example, as your congregation ages and congregants need more hospital and home visits, can the deacons effectively support the pastor in this area – if they are not already doing so?

Would additional staff, part-time ordained or staff that are not a minister of word and sacrament, be needed to accomplish your ministry goals?

What are your ministry goals for this church reaching others for Christ?

He also outlined the following:

As of May 1, 2023, Paul Knopf is still Magnolia's pastor.

It is Session's responsibility to decide on a pastoral model, and lead the process. It is important to share information with the congregation to discuss support of the model, and to be as transparent as possible.

Congregational input is up to the Session.

Once the model decision is made, a formal letter from Magnolia's Clerk of Session needs to go to the Stated Clerk of the Presbytery (our very own Co-Pastor Paul Knopf) to inform Presbytery of the decision. The HPCC will then advise Magnolia's Session on how to proceed.

A Mission Assessment could still be done, however, because Paul is still the pastor, it is not required.

Session in their planning, may find it useful to meet without the Pastor. They should work with the Pastor to accomplish this.

#### Team MagPres Does It Again!

On Sunday, March 26th, a dozen and a half of MagPres faithful were one of 373 teams registered for this year's CROP Hunger Walk here in Riverside to "end hunger one step at a time."

A nationwide movement sponsored by Church World Service, the CROP Walk raises funds to end hunger and poverty in the U.S. and around the world. So far in 2023, CROP Walks have raised \$255,036 nationwide. A big "Thank you" to all who donated, supported, and walked in the CROP Walk, Team MagPres Riverside Mission. We have raised over \$5,000 towards fighting hunger! Final total to come.



#### Power Ministries and Path of Life

Senda Da Vida is a refugee camp in Reynosa MX. I first visited this camp in 2013 and learned their story. Senda Da Vida means "Path of Life." The founder, Hector, is from El Salvador. He saw a need for a place for people trying to get into the U. S. but that were stuck at

the border with nowhere to go. He approached the mayor of the city and said he wanted to help. The mayor donated some land to him that was previously a landfill. Hector took that "dump" and changed it into a place where people could get help. At that time the place was built to house about 250 people and he had about 85 there.

In 2022 we visited and they were housing about 2500 people at that time, with tents everywhere and people stacked on top of each other. This year we visited and they have about

4500 people at the facility (opened a second facility nearby to help with the crowding) and there are about 1000 people on the street outside trying to get in when there is room for them. When we asked Hector how he feeds all of these people everyday he said, it's a miracle from God because we don't know where the food is coming from.

They have people here from all over the world using phone translators to communicate. The rules are simple, you live

here, you work to help keep the place clean, you work to help prepare food, you work to help maintain the place and you attend worship. The kids all go to school on site (again, taught in several languages). And there is no fighting. There are lots of little kids living here with their parents, hoping for a better life someday.

#### Compassion Sunday: April 16th

Jeff and I sponsor a compassion child in Peru. We signed up to sponsor Reyna when she was 4 years old, she is now 21 and in college. The money each month provided food, clothing, and a Christian school upbringing that taught her skills she could use to support herself and a family one day. We wrote each other and sent pictures back and forth. We attempted to visit her in 2020. COVID had other plans and the trip was postponed until 2022. We went to Peru, but still were unable to see her because of recent outbreaks in the country. Marge Ludwig also sponsored a boy for for many years and aged out of the program. Several years after she received a phone call from him and told her what the mentorship meant to him. Just 38 dollars a month can ensure a child in poverty is known, loved, and protected. The money provides educational assistance, tutoring, life skills, career development, nutritional support, sanitation and medical care, opportunity to love Jesus, mentorship, and Christian teaching and love. We will have a booth set up April 16<sup>th</sup> with pictures of children you can sponsor. Please pray about how you can help a child today!

# **Doin' Our Homework**

#### A Capital Campaign Update

Our Capital Campaign Committee (CCC) has launched the campaign for the rebuilding of our new sanctuary! We began with 11 donations of approximately \$65,000, and by mid March, we have already increased that to \$75,000! What a blessing it is to see our time, talents, and treasures already being so generously shared.

Pastor Claire has received approval for a synod grant for \$87,000, which should be awarded to us in June. She has also applied for a Presbytery Reserves grant, for possibly up to \$200,000. We await the results of drilling by Western Municipal Water District in our parking lot, which could provide \$100,000.

Our Treasurer, Jeff Ludwig, is working on an application for a low interest "Presbyterian Investment and Loan Program (P.I.L.P.)" loan, which would be similar to a mortgage. He is also monitoring the status of an Employee Retention Credits (ERC) refund that we applied for in the midst of COVID.

Also, our committee has been brainstorming ideas for major fundraising. In conjunction with our Stewardship Theme this year to "Think Differently," we have discussed projects like restoring a car to raffle (we have a donation of time from one of our members who has an auto repair business – we just need a car); posting our story on a variety of social media (Facebook, Instagram, Next Door); and encouraging our members to buy Stater Brother cards – they don't cost the buyer anything, but the church receives 5% of each card sold. So if you buy a card for \$100, you still get to spend the entire \$100, and the church receives \$5. It's a win-win for everyone.

At our last meeting, our chair, John Reinhardt, gave the CCC members "homework." We are to (1) pray for the sanctuary rebuild, and (2) share the "Rising from the Ashes" article with people and businesses with whom we are in contact. We can share hard copies, located in the narthex, or send digital copies by email. WILL YOU HELP US WITH OUR HOMEWORK? We want to do all we can to get the word out. We would also love to hear any major fundraising ideas from the members of our congregation. Just as in raising a child, "it takes a village" to raise a church from the ashes.

Bless you all for your part in the life of our church. May we do all things to the glory of God.
