

Some who answered this question noted that in Southern California, we have both the beaches and the mountains in such close proximity to each other. Maybe we don't have to choose either.



DEACON'S CORNER

I'm beginning the last half of my sixth year on the Board of Deacons. Each Deacon writes an Uplook article during the year. In my last two articles, I wrote about my remembrances of Cathy McGraw and Gary Welman. Both were Deacons lost through their passing. Again I'm writing about loss, but of a joyous kind. I'd be remiss not thanking Pastor Claire for the support and encouragement she so generously gave to the Deacons. She attended every meeting providing us with information about the church at large through her Pastor Reports. Her guidance and direction were invaluable. She also did a lot behind the scenes to help meet needs of congregants and others who came to the office door for help. She will be missed.

I have been the Treasurer during my time on the Board. I would also like to thank the congregation for your generous giving for the work of the Deacons through the offerings taken on Communion Sundays. Three hundred dollars a month of this money goes to help the food bank run by Lutheran Social Services. Odd months we give a cash donation. Even months I buy food at Costco. This job has been the most fun I've had as a Deacon. I've made a game out of coming as close to \$300.00 as I can. April I came in at \$299.96. At our last meeting, the Deacons voted to make a one time donation of a \$1000.00 to Family Promise to help them provide meals for the families under their care. Your donations have also supported the food boxes assembled during the Christmas season.

Back to Lutheran Social Services. The church also collects food items for them on Two- Sunday. It's been fun watching Gary Grant, Gary Welman, and now Lance Mordue take leadership of this program. They set a yearly goal for number of cans collected and all have taken it personally if donations don't meet their goals. So keep those cans coming!

While I have this platform, I'm going to solicit your service for a couple of other food related ministries that fall under the Mission Committee. The first is the feeding program at the Hulen Center homeless shelter. We provide dinner on the second Saturday of the month. This food is funded through a Stater Bros grant. We have four great team leaders that prepare the food. The last Rooted group stepped up to take the fourth spot. During Covid, team leaders dropped food off. We would like to be able to go inside and serve the food again. That interaction is a big part of the ministry. Volunteers are needed to help do this. It's not a huge time commitment, just 5:30 to 7:00 PM on a Saturday evening three times a year. Let me know if you would be willing to help. Finally, meals are needed nightly for families being supported by Family Promise. Mary Lee is the contact person for information regarding meal train sign ups.

I have a running joke with my sister. She's Mary and I'm Martha at all of our family gatherings. I guess it's evident that my niche is feeding hungry people who a lot of the time go without food.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

Recently, there have been some major decisions made by Session:

- With the final construction bid topping \$4.4 million, your Elders decided the current design is untenable, and voted to investigate other architects, to go ahead with the foundation as designed, and to pour the slab. Detailed building information from Elder Ann Laudermilk and Pastor Paul, is available on the May 11 and 18, 2023 E-Blast.
- Session is nearing a decision on the pastoral model moving forward, having taken a straw poll at their May 10 workshop, and weighing all options available. Another workshop is scheduled for June 4, 2023.
