#### A Pastor's Ponderings

Perhaps you felt it too. Over the last few months. The ground shook. And it shook. And it shook again. Earthquakes are a part of life in Southern California, but seemingly, they have increased in frequency recently (at least 8 with a magnitude of 4.0 or higher).

Do you remember, a number of years ago, on Easter Sunday, that rolling earthquake that went

on and on. It was about a minute and a half. We had finished our Easter meal and were hanging it when it began to roll. I often wonder if there was any cosmic relevance to that quake.

For thousands of years people did their best to explain what earthquakes meant. In Greek mythology, earthquakes occurred when the hot-tempered god of the sea, Poseidon, struck the ground with his trident. In a Native American tradition, earthquakes were the result of the Great Spirit stomping his foot. In Mexico, the devil rips open the earth so demons can escape and cause trouble on earth. In Hawaiian folklore, the demigod Maui pulled the islands out from the ocean, and sometimes a part gets loose, shaking the ground.

Earthquakes even occur in the Bible. An earthquake shakes the foundation of a prison in Acts 16. The earth shakes when God appears before Elijah in 1 Kings 19. An earthquake, or a sinkhole, swallows the homes of Korah, Dathan, and Abiram in Numbers 16. The earth even shakes when Jesus dies on the Cross (Matthew 27). But my favorite earthquake story in the Bible happens on that first Easter Sunday, when an angel of the Lord descended from heaven to roll back the stone from the tomb and sat on it (Matthew 28:2). The earth shook when Christ died, as if to say all was not right, but then the earth shook again on Easter, seemingly to indicate not only are things right, but things are now different, and better.

I still wonder what, if anything, that earthquake on April 4, 2010, Easter Sunday meant. Did something cosmic happen that day? What happens if there is an earthquake this Easter?

Those attending via Zoom simply sign in to Zoom and use the Meeting ID: 259 885 602 and the Password 7200 to join the fun.


